Connie Jensen has been competing in junior, adult, and senior bowling leagues for over 60 years. She has won numerous Wichita Women's Bowling Association (WWBA) tournament titles, including team, doubles and all-events, and has also been named to several Great Plains All-star teams and Senior All-star teams.

Connie also served as the secretary for various leagues.

Connie was a charter member of the Jimmie's Diner team which captured many local and state championships.

- In 1989, she became the recipient of the Bernice James Memorial Award for bowling the WWBA city tournament high game of 290, as well as the Nellie Pestinger Award for high series of 718.
- She also won 1<sup>st</sup> place in the doubles competition in the Kansas State tournament that same year with her partner, fellow inductee, Margo Nunn.
- In 1994, Connie set a record by becoming the first woman to shoot an 800 series in the city of Wichita,
- In 2001, she was inducted into the WWBA Hall of Fame and in 2016, finally rolled her first 300.
