Don has been an active member of the Wichita Bowling Association as a director since 1980. For his dedication and contributions to the sport he has received the “Director of the Year” twice, in 1989 and 1991. He was elected to the Wichita Bowling Association Hall of Fame in 1989. Don became a member of the Wichita area by way of the U. S. Air Force in 1964, where he competed a twenty-year military tour, and was medically retired in 1970.

He began bowling as a means of physical therapy in 1965. He did not let his handicap stand in his way. His high average of 174 and high game of 276, with a high series of 695, are only a part of his true dedication to the game of bowling. Don’s involvement in bowling became evident when he started promoting the game. His interest began with the Afro-Americans and promoting bowling in general.

He completed the AJBC Coach Instructor course in 1974 and has been a tournament coordinator for several tournaments.
