Justin started bowling at age 7 at Rose Bowl East and at the age of 9 bowled his first 600 series and at age 13 bowled his first 300 game. In 1982, he was featured in Sports Illustrated magazine "Faces in the Crowd" and in 1985 was awarded the "Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow Award" by the American Bowling Congress. In 1982 he won the Coca-Cola National Youth Championships. Justin bowled for Wichita State University bowling team from 1985 through 1989. He was a member of the National Collegiate Championship Team in 1987 and was the Tournament MVP at the 1988 National Championships. He was First Team Collegiate All-American Team in 1988. He brought home a gold medal in the First International Youth Bowling Championships in Manila, Philippines.

Justin joined the PBA in 1989 and bowled on the tour until he retired in 2005. His professional resume includes three National Tour titles and three PBA Regional titles. In his 14 years on tour, he cashed in 205 of 333 events and was 3-11 in 14 career televised finals appearances, with a 220.46 average. Justin has 30 + PBA 300 games, 40 + sanctioned 300 games, with 9- 800 series to his credit , 829 his high.
