Larry began bowling in 1960, when a team was formed by his fellow employees. He joined the classic leagues within the third year of his competition.

In the 1966-67 bowling season he carried an unbelievable 201 average, in only his seventh season. In the 1966-67 season he rolled the first of five career 300 games. In the 1970-71 season he had three 800's in which one was an 867 series. At that time, the 867 was the third highest bowling series in history. Another 800 during the 1973-74 bowling season, helped him win State Doubles Title.

In 1968 Larry was named Topeka Bowler of the Year, by the Topeka Bowling Association. He also was the Topeka Masters tournament champion in 1967. The same year he was a part of the Kansas State Team Champions.

Personal achievements include 5-300, 4-800's 94-700's, 7-299's, 4-298's and 1-297 game. He has competed in 20 A B C National Tournaments.

Topeka Bowling Association's Hall of Fame in 1985, served on the board as a director for four years. He also helped Wayne Sanders with the youth program at Meadow Lanes for 29 years and has been a leader in bowling both on and off the lanes, for some 30 years. In 1988-89 Larry had to stop bowling due to health reasons, but he left, as the first Topeka player to ever average 223.
