Lonnie attended Wichita State University from 1989-1993, where he was a two (2) time Collegiate All-American in 1991 and 1992. In 1993, he was a member of the Collegiate National Team Champions. In 1989, he was elected as the USBC Chuck Hall Star of tomorrow winner.

**Lonnie's father, Paul was the founder of bowling at Wichita State University, as their first coach.** The program today has many elite bowlers and Lonnie is just one of them to come from this talented program.

Lonnie was a member of the USBC Team Challenge champions in 1995 and 1996. He was selected as a First Team Bowlers Journal All American in 2003. He has 19 career PBA 300 games and over 30 other sanctioned 300 games to his credit. In the 2004-05 seasons, it was Lonnie's last season as an exempt player. His two tour titles came in the 2002-03 season. He owns 10 PBA Regional titles, with one of them being the 2005 Budweiser Wichita Open Tournament at Thunderbird Bowl.

In the 2009-10 seasons, he bowled with brother Brian and was the first brothers bowling on the PBA tour at the same time since Mark & Mike Scroggins in the 2006-2007 seasons. In 2010-11, Lonnie had his best finish of fifth in the Brunswick Pro Bowling Cheetah Championship and 9<sup>th</sup> in the Dick Weber PBA playoffs. He ranked 22<sup>nd</sup> in average with a 216.47 and was 34<sup>th</sup> in earnings with \$ 23,255.00.

As you can tell Lonnie has a passion for the game of bowling and enjoys teaching/instructing others to have success on and off the lanes.
