Lowell was an active member of the American Bowling Congress from 1947 until his death in 1989. He began his bowling career at an 8-lane center in Nevada, Missouri, and later a 16-lane center, before moving to Kansas City to take over the North Kansas City Bowl. In 1960 he opened the new Countryside Lanes in Hutchinson, Kansas, and retired from there in 1981, when the facility was sold.

Lowell's management philosophy centered around customer service, from the front to the back of the bowling establishment. He believed that being a bowler meant being a happier, healthier person.

Lowell was a member of the Bowling Proprietors Association, serving on zone, state and national committees, and as an officer in the zone and state for many years. He was also a promoter for the youth programs. He knew they were the future of the sport, and he did what was best, to promote the game of bowling to the youth. Lowell's contributions will and have been deeply missed, for it is his hard work and commitment to the sport, that has made it successful today.
